Senator Ruben Gallego (D-AZ)



<u>Biography</u>

Senator Ruben Gallego (D-AZ) was born in Chicago, Illinois, to immigrant parents from Colombia and Mexico. He grew up in a working-class family and was raised by a single mother alongside three sisters. Sen. Gallego earned admission to Harvard University, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in International Relations in 2004.

Following his education, Sen. Gallego enlisted in the Marine Corps, serving as an infantryman in Iraq with Lima Company, 3rd Battalion, 25th Marines from 2005 to 2006.

Sen. Gallego began his political career in the Arizona House of Representatives, serving from 2010 to 2014. He was then elected

to the U.S. House of Representatives in 2014, representing Arizona's 7th congressional district. He served five terms in the House, focusing on issues such as veterans' affairs, national security, and tribal rights.

In the House, Sen. Gallego served on the Armed Services Committee and chaired the Intelligence and Special Operations subcommittee. He also served on the Natural Resources Committee and the Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States, where he championed tribal sovereignty and federal trust responsibilities to Native Americans and Alaska Natives.

Sen. Gallego ran for the U.S. Senate seat in Arizona in 2024, defeating Republican candidate Kari Lake.

Senator Lisa Blunt Rochester (D-DE)



Biography

Senator Lisa Blunt Rochester (D-DE) was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and grew up in Wilmington, Delaware. She earned a Bachelor of Arts in International Relations from Fairleigh Dickinson University and a Master's degree in Urban Affairs and Public Policy from the University of Delaware.

Sen. Blunt Rochester began her career in public service as an intern and caseworker for then-Congressman Tom Carper (D-DE). She went on to serve in various roles in Delaware state government, including as Deputy Secretary of Health and Social Services (1993-1998), Secretary of Labor (1998-2001), and State Personnel Director (2001-2004).

In 2016, Sen. Blunt Rochester ran for Delaware's at-large congressional district and won, becoming the first woman and first African American to represent Delaware in Congress. She served in the U.S. House of Representatives from 2017 to 2024.

During her time in the House, Sen. Blunt Rochester served on the Energy and Commerce Committee and the Agriculture Committee. She was also a member of the Congressional Progressive Caucus and the Congressional Black Caucus.

In 2024, Sen. Blunt Rochester successfully ran for the U.S. Senate seat being vacated by her former boss, Sen Tom Carper. She won the election, defeating Republican candidate Eric Hansen.

Senator Jim Banks (R-IN)



Biography

Born in Columbia City, Indiana, Senator Jim Banks (R-IN) earned his undergraduate degree in Political Science from Indiana University Bloomington and later received an MBA from Grace College & Seminary.

After college, Sen. Banks served in the U.S. Navy Reserve as a Supply Corps officer. In 2014 and 2015, he took a leave of absence from the Indiana State Senate to deploy to Afghanistan during Operations Enduring Freedom and Freedom's Sentinel.

Sen. Banks began his political career serving on the Whitley County Council from 2008 to 2010. He then moved to the Indiana State Senate, representing the 17th district from 2010 to 2016. During his time in the state legislature, he chaired

the Senate Veteran Affairs and the Military Committee.

In 2016, Sen. Banks was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives for Indiana's 3rd congressional district. He served on the House Armed Services Committee, Education and the Workforce Committee, and the Select Committee on Strategic Competition between the United States and the Chinese Communist Party. Additionally, from 2021 to 2023, he chaired the Republican Study Committee.

In January 2023, Sen. Banks announced his candidacy for the U.S. Senate seat being vacated by Sen. Mike Braun. He won the Republican nomination unopposed and went on to defeat Democratic nominee Valerie McCray in the November 2024 general election.

Senator Angela Alsobrooks (D-MD)



Biography

Senator Angela Alsobrooks (D-MD) was born on February 23, 1971, in Camp Springs, Maryland. She graduated from Benjamin Banneker High School in Washington, D.C. and earned a Bachelor of Arts in Public Policy and Afro-American Studies from Duke University in 1993. Sen. Alsobrooks received her Juris Doctor from the University of Maryland School of Law in 1996.

Sen. Alsobrooks began her career as an assistant state's attorney in Prince George's County, Maryland. In 2010, she was elected as the first woman State's Attorney for Prince

George's County, where she focused on reducing violent crime and implementing programs for juvenile offenders. In 2018, she became the first woman and first Black woman to serve as County Executive of Prince George's County, prioritizing education, economic development, and public safety.

In 2024, Sen. Alsobrooks was elected to the United States Senate, becoming Maryland's first Black Senator and first female Senator, beating out former Maryland Governor Larry Hogan. Her campaign emphasized job creation, reducing the cost of living, and protecting fundamental freedoms.

Senator Elissa Slotkin (D-MI)



Biography

Senator Elissa Slotkin (D-MI) was born in New York City, but grew up on her family's farm in Holly, Michigan. She earned a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology from Cornell University in 1998 and a Master of International Affairs from Columbia University in 2003.

After graduate school, Sen. Slotkin joined the Central Intelligence Agency as a Middle East analyst. She served three tours in Iraq alongside the U.S. military. Sen. Slotkin then held various national security positions in both the Bush and Obama administrations, including roles at the White House, State Department, and Pentagon. From 2015 to 2017, she served as Acting Assistant Secretary of Defense for International Security Affairs.

In 2018, Sen. Slotkin was elected to represent Michigan's 8th congressional district in the U.S. House of Representatives. She served three terms in the House, focusing on issues such as national security, healthcare, and economic development.

In 2024, Sen. Slotkin successfully ran for the U.S. Senate seat vacated by Sen. Debbie Stabenow. She defeated Republican candidate Mike Rogers in the general election, becoming the second woman to represent Michigan in the Senate.

Senator Tim Sheehy (R-MT)



Biography

Senator Tim Sheehy (R-MT) was born in Ramsey County, Minnesota, and grew up in the nearby town of Shoreview, Minnesota. After graduating from the U.S. Naval Academy in 2008, he went on to serve as a Navy Seal and later attended Army Ranger School. Sen. Sheehy served in the Navy from 2008 to 2019, deploying to Iraq, Afghanistan, and other conflicts before leaving active duty in 2014.

Following his departure from active duty, Sen. Sheehy founded the aerial firefighting and aerospace services company Bridger Aerospace in 2014. He later co-founded the Little Belt Cattle Company in 2020 which sources beef from its 20,000-acre ranch. In the lead-up to his Senate campaign, he resigned from the board of the Montanabased non-profit Property and Environment Research

Center (PERC) and his role as Chief Executive Officer of Bridger Aerospace.

In 2024, Sen. Sheehy successfully ran for Senate in Montana, defeating incumbent U.S. Senator Jon Tester in the general election to solidify the state's republican control in Congress.

Senator Bernie Moreno (R-OH)



Biography

Senator Bernie Moreno (R-OH) was born in Bogota, Colombia, and later moved to Fort Lauderdale, Florida where he was raised. Sen. Moreno earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Michigan and soon after began his career as an automotive dealer with General Motors. After moving to Massachusetts and assuming the position of general manager of The Herb Chambers Companies, he relocated to Ohio in 2005 to purchase his first car dealership in North Olmsted, Ohio.

Sen. Moreno later became the president of the car dealership company Collection Auto Group, eventually amassing 25 dealerships through the company. In 2019, he created blockchain-based technology company, Ownum. Soon after,

Sen. Moreno was appointed to the board of trustees for the MetroHealth System.

In April of 2021, Sen. Moreno announced his candidacy for the Republican nomination for the U.S. Senate to replace Incumbent Sen. Rob Portman but later dropped out of the race in 2022. In April of 2023, Sen. Moreno again entered the race for the Republican nomination for U.S. Senate.

In, 2024 Sen. Bernie Moreno was elected to the U.S. Senate, successfully defeating incumbent Ohio Senator Sherrod Brown in the general election.

Senator Dave McCormick (R-PA)



Biography

Senator David (Dave) McCormick was elected in 2024 to represent Pennsylvania in the United States Senate after defeating incumbent Democratic Senator Bob Casey. Sen. McCormick grew up in Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania. He is a seventh generation Pennsylvanian, and both of his parents were involved in higher level education. Sen. McCormick was the first person from his hometown to attend the United Sates Military Academy West Point where he graduated with a Bachelor of Science. After graduation he then served in the 82nd Airborne division. During this time, he was deployed to the Middle East and received a Bronze Star before retiring from military service as a captain. Sen. McCormick then attended Princeton University where he received a Ph.D. in International Relations.

Sen. McCormick then returned to Pennsylvania following his graduation from Princeton where he worked for tech startup FreeMarkets, eventually becoming its CEO.

In 2005 Sen. McCormick was confirmed as the Commerce Department's Under Secretary of Commerce for Industry and Security, he then served as Deputy National Security Advisor for International Economic Policy before he was moved to Under Secretary of Treasury for International Affairs in 2007 for President George W. Bush. Following his public service, he joined an investment group called Bridgewater Associates where he was CEO until he resigned to run for the U.S. Senate seat in 2022 and then again in 2024. He was notably offered the role of U.S. Deputy Secretary of Defense during the Trump Administration but declined in order to remain at Bridgewater

Senator John Curtis (R-UT)



<u>Biography</u>

Born in Ogden, Utah, Senator John Curtis (R-UT) earned a degree in business management from Brigham Young University. After graduating, he worked for the employee recognition company OC Tanner and the Citizen Watch Company before assuming the position of Chief Operating Officer of Action Target, a manufacturer of custom shooting ranges.

Sen. Curtis initially ran for public office in 2002 for the Utah State Senate as a Democrat but was defeated by Republican Curt Bramble in the general election. Following the loss, Curtis would serve as vice chairman and chairman of the Utah County Democratic Party from 2002 to 2003. Curtis was later elected mayor of Provo, Utah in 2009 where he focused

on economic development and environmental stewardship.

In 2017, Sen. Curtis announced his candidacy for Utah's 3rd congressional district as a Republican, eventually winning his race to replace retiring U.S. Representative Jason Chaffetz. He went on to serve three terms in Congress, focusing on trade policy, public lands management, and economic development.

In 2024, Sen. Curtis announced his candidacy for the United States Senate and ultimately won the general election to replace long-time Senator Mitt Romney in Washington DC. His campaign focused on his past legislative and community achievements along with supporting public lands and bolstering economic development.

Senator Jim Justice (R-WV)



Biography

Senator Jim Justice (R-WV) was born in Charleston, West Virginia, and earned a bachelor's degree and Master of Business Administration from Marshall University. After graduating, he founded Bluestone Farms in 1977 which has grown to become the largest producer of grain on the East Coast. After his father's death, Sen. Justice inherited ownership of Bluestone Industries and Bluestone Coal Corporation and owned or served as the Chief Executive Officer of over 50 companies before taking office.

Sen. Jim Justice initially ran for the office of Governor of West Virginia in 2016 as a member of the Democratic party. Months after defeating his Republican challenger in the November 2016 general election, Sen. Justice changed his party affiliation

and went on to win re-election on the Republican ticket in 2019.

In April of 2023, Sen. Jim Justice announced his candidacy for the 2024 U.S. Senate election in West Virginia and ultimately defeated the former Democratic mayor of Wheeling, West Virginia, Glenn Elliott, to replace Democratic incumbent Senator Joe Manchin in Washington DC.

Representative Shomari Figures (D-AL)



Biography

Representative Shomari Figures (D-AL) was born in Mobile, Alabama, and is the son of the late Michael Figures, a civil rights attorney and Alabama state Senator, and Vivian Davis Figures, who succeeded her husband in the Alabama Senate.

Rep. Figures earned a Bachelor of Arts in criminal justice and history from the University of Alabama in 2006 and a Juris Doctor from the University of Alabama School of Law in 2010.

After law school, Rep. Figures clerked for Judge Nannette A. Baker in the Eastern District of Missouri. He worked as a field organizer for Barack Obama's 2012 reelection campaign in Ohio. Figures then held several positions in the Obama administration, including domestic director of the White House Presidential Personnel

Office and White House liaison to Attorney General Loretta Lynch.

Rep. Figures later served as legislative counsel for U.S. Senator Sherrod Brown (D-OH) and worked on President Joe Biden's presidential transition team. From 2021 to 2023, he was deputy chief of staff for Attorney General Merrick Garland.

In 2024, Rep. Figures was elected to represent Alabama's 2nd congressional district in the U.S. House of Representatives. He is the first Democrat to win this seat since the district was redrawn to create a second majority-Black district in Alabama.

Representative Nicholas "Nick" Begich (R-AK) was born in Anchorage, Alaska, but grew up in Florida with his maternal grandparents after his parents divorced. Rep. Begich founded FarShore Partners, a software development company with over 120 employees. He also co-founded Dashfire, a firm that has helped launch over 50 technology businesses.

In 2016, Rep. Begich ran unsuccessfully for the Anchorage City Council. He served as a board member of the Alaska Policy Forum and co-chair of the Alaska Republican Party's Finance Committee.

Rep. Begich ran for Alaska's at-large congressional district in 2022, losing to Democrat Mary Peltola in both the special and regular elections. In 2024, he successfully defeated Peltola, winning the seat with 51.3% of the vote in the final round of ranked-choice voting.

Begich lives in Chugiak, Alaska, with his wife Dharna and their son Nicholas.

Biography

Representative Yassamin Ansari (D-AZ) was born in Arizona to Iranian immigrant parents. She graduated from Stanford University with a Bachelor of Arts in international relations and earned a master's degree from the University of Cambridge.

Rep. Ansari began her career as an advisor in the United Nations Executive Office, working on climate policy with Secretaries-General Ban Ki-moon and António Guterres. She helped develop the Paris Climate Agreement and worked with California Governor Jerry Brown's office on climate initiatives.

In 2020, Rep. Ansari was elected to the Phoenix City Council, becoming the youngest woman and first Iranian-American elected

to public office in Arizona. As a council member, she represented Phoenix's 7th district, and created the Office of Heat Response and Mitigation and helped develop Phoenix's Climate Action Plan.

Rep. Ansari served as Vice Mayor of Phoenix and resigned from the city council in March 2024 to run for Congress in Arizona's 3rd congressional district. She was recognized as a Forbes 30 Under 30 in Law & Policy and a Grist 50 "Fixer" for her climate change work.

In 2024, Rep. Ansari ran to succeed Rep. Ruben Gallego in Arizona's 3rd District, facing Republican Jeff Zink and secured victory by a margin of 45 points.

Representative Abraham Hamadeh (R-AZ) was born in Chicago, Illinois, to Syrian and Venezuelan immigrant parents. He later moved to Phoenix, Arizona.

Rep. Hamadeh attended Arizona State University for his undergraduate degree, earning a Bachelor of Science in Political Science. He later received his Juris Doctor from the University of Arizona College of Law, where he was awarded the Udall Fellowship by the Arizona Prosecuting Attorneys' Advisory Council.

After passing the Arizona Bar Exam in May 2017, Rep. Hamadeh began working as a prosecutor in the Maricopa County Attorney's Office. He resigned from this role in September 2021

to focus on his political career.

Rep. Hamadeh has served in the U.S. Army Reserve as an intelligence officer since 2016, attaining the rank of captain. He was deployed to Saudi Arabia in 2020 for 14 months, receiving a Meritorious Service Medal for his service.

In 2022, Rep. Hamadeh ran for Arizona Attorney General, narrowly losing to Democrat Kris Mayes by fewer than 300 votes. He contested the election results in multiple lawsuits, which were ultimately unsuccessful.

In 2024, Rep. Hamadeh successfully ran for the U.S. House of Representatives in Arizona's 8th congressional district, beating out Democrat Greg Whitten.

By 19, she became its Executive Director, leading transformative initiatives to support women involved in the juvenile justice system. Simon has served as President of the Akonadi Foundation, advocating for racial justice, and as a member of the Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) Board of Directors, she prioritized accessible and equitable public transportation. She was also appointed by Governor Jerry

Brown to the California State University Board of Trustees in 2016.

Holding a Bachelor of Arts in Public Policy from Mills College and a Master of Public Administration from the University of San Francisco, Rep. Simon's work is deeply informed by her firsthand experiences as a legally blind single mother. Her congressional campaign focused on issues like criminal justice reform, affordable housing, and public transportation, reflecting her lifelong dedication to social justice and community empowerment.

As mayor, he led efforts on pension reform, transportation projects like the expansion of Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) to San Jose, and environmental initiatives, including preserving thousands of acres in Coyote Valley.

In February 2023, he announced his candidacy for California's 27th congressional district and won the election on November 5, 2024, defeating incumbent Republican Mike Garcia.

Rep. Friedman began her political career by joining the Glendale City Council in 2009 and served as Mayor of Glendale from 2011 to 2012. In 2016, she won election to the California State Assembly, representing the 43rd district until 2022, after which she represented the 44th district. During her tenure, Rep. Friedman authored a landmark pro-housing bill that eliminated minimum parking requirements for housing near mass transit stations throughout California; Governor Gavin Newsom signed this bill into law in 2022.

They used their winnings to establish the Gilbert and Jacki Cisneros Foundation, focusing on educational initiatives and scholarships for Latino students.

After transitioning into politics, Rep. Cisneros was elected as the U.S. Representative for California's 39th congressional district in 2018, serving from 2019 to 2021. During his tenure, he was a member of the House Armed Services and Veterans Affairs Committees. In 2021, President Joe Biden appointed him as Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness, a position he held until September 2023.

Representative Derek Tran was born in 1980, in California to Vietnamese refugee parents. He grew up in the San Gabriel Valley, working in his family's corner market after school.

Rep. Tran is married to Michelle, a pharmacist, and they have three children. Together, they own a pharmacy in Orange County. Tran also serves on the board of the Consumer Attorneys Association of America, and mentors at-risk youth at Sunburst Academy.

Schmidt narrowly lost the 2022 Kansas gubernatorial race to incumbent Democrat Laura Kelly.

In 2020, he successfully ran for Montana State Auditor, defeating Democrat Representative Shane Morigeau in the general election. As an auditor, he focused on consumer protection and increasing transparency in the insurance and securities industries. In 2024, Rep. Goodlander taught constitutional law at the University of New Hampshire and Dartmouth College and served on the boards of the New Hampshire Women's Foundation, New Hampshire Legal Assistance, the World Affairs Council of New Hampshire, and the Rudman Center Advisory Board. In 2021, she joined the U.S. Department of Justice as a deputy assistant attorney general overseeing the international, appellate, and policy work of the department's Antitrust Division under Attorney General Merrick Garland. After her work at the Justice Department, she briefly served as a White House senior advisor and led the Biden administration's unity agenda.

In May of 2024, Rep. Goodlander announced her candidacy for New Hampshire's 2nd congressional district, eventually winning the general election.

Representative Herb Conway (D-NJ)



Biography

Representative Herbert 'Herb' Clark Hoover Conway Jr (D-NJ) was born in Trenton, New Jersey, and earned a Bachelor of Arts in politics from Princeton University. He would go on to receive a Doctor of Medicine degree from Thomas Jefferson University and a Juris Doctorate from Rutgers School of Law.

After graduating, Rep. Conway served in the United States Air Force Medical Corps, reaching the rank of Captain and serving as a general medical officer as well as an assistant director of the primary care clinic. Following his internal medicine residency, he began his practice in primary care settings before teaching as a professor at Cooper University Hospital.

During the initial years of his medical career, Rep. Conway was elected to the New Jersey General

Assembly from the 7th district and was eventually chosen to serve as the Assembly's Deputy Speaker from 2002 to 2005. During his tenure in the General Assembly, he served as the Chair of the Health Committee and also served on the Budget and Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Rep. Conway initially ran for U.S. Representative in New Jersey's 3rd congressional district in 2004 but lost to his Republican challenger Jim Saxton. He would later join the 2024 race for the same seat in Congress after Rep. Andy Kim entered the U.S. Senate race, winning the general election.

Representative Nellie Pou (D-NJ)



Biography

Representative Nellie Pou (D-NJ) was born and raised in Paterson, New Jersey, and earned degrees from Kean College, Rutgers University, and the University of Virginia. During her political career, she worked for the City of Patterson in various roles including business administrator, director of human services, and CETA training and education coordinator.

Rep. Pou was appointed to a vacant seat in the New Jersey General Assembly in 1997 and would eventually serve as the Assembly's Deputy Speaker and Assistant Minority Leader until 2012. During her tenure in the Assembly, she served on the Appropriations, Budget, Education, and Joint Budget Oversight Committees.

In 2012, she announced her candidacy for New Jersey State Senate and won her race to represent the state's 35th district. In the Senate, she served as the Chair of

the Commerce Committee as well as the Vice Chair of the Judiciary Committee. Rep. Pou served in the New Jersey State Senate until the Passaic County Democratic Committee nominated her to run for New Jersey's 9th congressional district to replace Representative Bill Pascrell (D-NJ).

In the 2024 election, she would go on to defeat the Republican challenger and will represent New Jersey in the 119th Congress.

Representative Laura Gillen (D-NY)



Biography

Representative Laura Gillen (D-NY) is an American politician and attorney who is the United States House of Representatives member-elect for New York's 4th Congressional District. Rep. Gillen previously served as the Town Supervisor of Hempstead, New York, where she made history as the first Democrat in over 100 years to hold the position.

Born and raised in Baldwin, New York, Rep. Gillen cultivated an early interest in governance and public service. She earned her undergraduate degree in political science and government from Georgetown University and her Juris Doctor from the prestigious New York University School of Law. She then built a successful legal career, specializing in commercial litigation at Westerman Ball Ederer Miller Zucker & Sharfstein, LLP.

Rep. Gillen's political career turned historic in 2017 when she narrowly defeated incumbent Anthony J. Santino to become Hempstead Town Supervisor. Despite being outspent by \$1.2 million, she secured a victory by a margin of 2,268 votes, transforming the political landscape of the town. As Supervisor, Rep. Gillen prioritized transparency, fiscal responsibility, and infrastructure improvements. She introduced a five-year capital plan that included \$160 million in highway upgrades and the rehabilitation of critical town facilities like the 311-service center and a water testing lab.

Representative George Latimer (D-NY)



Biography

Representative George Latimer (D-NY) is an American politician and the member-elect of the U.S. House of Representatives for New York's 16th Congressional District. He has served as County Executive of Westchester County, New York, since 2018, and his career spans decades of public service at both local and state levels.

He earned a bachelor's degree from Fordham University in 1974. Representative Latiner pursued a master's in public administration at New York University's Wagner School, graduating in 1976. While earning his graduate degree, he worked part-time as a budget analyst and later as a housing coordinator in Mount Vernon, managing Section 8 housing programs.

Before entering politics, Rep. Latimer spent two decades

as a marketing executive in the hospitality industry, working for prominent organizations, including subsidiaries of Nestlé and ITT.

Rep. Latimer's political career began in 1987 when he won a seat on the Rye City Council. In 1991, he made history as the first Democrat elected to represent the 7th District on the Westchester County Board of Legislators. He won re-election multiple times, and in 1998, he helped Democrats gain a majority on the County Board for the first time in 90 years. Rep. Latimer was elected as the board's first Democratic chairman, serving two terms in that role.

In 2004, Rep. Latimer transitioned to state-level politics, where he won a seat in the New York State Assembly and represented the 91st District until 2012. He then served in the New York State Senate, representing the 37th District from 2013 to 2017. In 2017, he successfully ran for Westchester County Executive, unseating incumbent Republican Rob Astorino.

Representative Josh Riley (D-NY) was born in Endicott, New York and has built a career rooted in public service, legal advocacy, and community engagement. In Upstate New York, Rep. While in college, he worked as an aide to U.S. Representative Maurice Hinchey (D-NY).

In 2004, he began his legal studies at Harvard Law School, where he served as a Heyman Fellow on the U.S. Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions and volunteered

with a legal aid clinic to assist victims of Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans. Rep. Riley graduated in 2007 with a Juris Doctor and received the Dean's Award for Community Leadership, presented by then-Dean Elena Kagan, now a U.S. Supreme Court Justice.

Rep. Riley began his legal career as an associate at Boies Schiller Flexner LLP in 2007. From 2009 to 2010, he clerked for Judge Kim McLane Wardlaw on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. Rep. Riley returned to Boies Schiller Flexner LLP in 2010 before transitioning to public service in 2011 as general counsel to Senator Al Franken (D-MN) on the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee, where he worked on key legislative issues, including judicial nominations and constitutional law. In 2014, Rep. Riley returned to Boies Schiller Flexner LLP, where he became a partner before joining Jenner & Block as a partner in 2021.

Representative John Mannion (D-NY)



Biography

Representative John Mannion (D-NY) is an American politician and former high school biology teacher who has served as the New York State Senator for the 50th district since 2020. Representative Mannion's rise in politics made him the first Democrat to represent the 50th Senate District in over 50 years.

Rep. Mannion earned a Bachelor of Science in biology from Binghamton University and a Master of Science in secondary science education from SUNY Oswego. He began his career as a high school biology teacher in the West Genesee Central School District, where he also served as president of the West Genesee Teachers' Association, advocating for educators and public education.

In 2018, Rep. Mannion launched his political career by running for the New York State Senate in the 50th district. Although he narrowly lost to Republican incumbent Bob Antonacci, he ran again in 2020 and won 52.57% of the vote, defeating Republican Representative, Angi Renna. His victory marked a historic shift, as he became the first Democrat to hold the seat in more than half a century. Rep. Mannion's 2022 re-election campaign was among the most closely contested in the state. Initially trailing by 396 votes on election night, a recount declared him the winner by just ten votes, making it the closest race in the 2022 New York State Senate elections.

Throughout his tenure in the State Senate, Rep. Mannion chaired the Committee on Disabilities, where he championed the rights of individuals with disabilities and their families. He also served on the Committees on Education, Environmental Conservation, Housing, and Internet and Technology.

Representative Mark Harris (R-NC) was born in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, and earned a bachelor's degree in political science from Appalachian State University. He also earned a Master of Divinity and a Doctor of Ministry from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary.

Rep. Harris served as the lead pastor at Trinity Baptist Church in Mooresville, North Carolina, and the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina president. He had previously worked as the senior pastor of the First Baptist Church in North Carolina and the Curtis Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia.

In 2014, Rep. Harris ran to represent North Carolina in the U.S. Senate and later entered the race for U.S.

Representative in the 9th Congressional District, eventually losing both races. In 2017, He resigned from the First Baptist Church to enter the 2018 election for North Carolina's 9th congressional district. After winning the initial election, the North Calonia State Board of Elections found that a staffer for Rep. Harris' campaign had violated multiple voting laws leading to a special election that Rep. Harris did not enter.

Rep. Harris announced his candidacy for U.S. Representative in North Carolina's 8th district in 2023 and would eventually defeat his Democratic challenger, Justin Dues, to represent North Carolina in Washington.

In 2002, he began his political career in the North Carolina House of Representatives as a representative for the 111th district. When Republicans gained the majority in the North Carolina House, Speaker Thom Tillis appointed Rep.

Moore as the Chairman of the Rules Committee.

His tenure on the North Carolina House leadership team and his advocacy for conservative legislation led to his tenure as speaker of the North Carolina House. As speaker, Rep. Moore focused his efforts on advancing conservative principles and advancing school safety measures. In 2019, he led a successful effort to override the veto of the state budget from then-Democratic Governor Roy Cooper.

In 2023, Rep. Moore announced his candidacy for the newly drawn 14th congressional district in North Carolina, eventually winning his race to represent North Carolina in Washington.

Rep. Fedorchak's career in public office began in December 2012, when Governor Jack Dalrymple appointed her to the North Dakota Public Service Commission. She quickly established herself as a capable leader, winning elections to retain her seat in 2014, 2016, and 2022, often by wide margins. During her tenure, she was elected chair of the commission for a two-year term and played a key role in overseeing energy projects and infrastructure investments and ensuring transparency and accountability in the commission's work.

She was re-elected to her seat in the Oregon House before resigning from office in 2024 to focus on her congressional campaign. In the November general election, Rep. Dexter defeated her Republican challenger, Joanna Harbour, to represent Oregon's 3rd district in Washington.

Representative Janelle Bynum (D-OR) is an American politician and businesswoman who has served as a member of the Oregon House of Representatives since 2016. Rep. Bynum currently represents the 39th district, covering northern Clackamas County, including most of Happy Valley and parts of Oregon City and Milwaukie. In November 2024, she was elected to the United States House of Representatives, representing Oregon's 5th district, and will become the first Black member of Congress from Oregon.

Born and raised in Washington, D.C., Rep. Bynum attended The Madeira School before earning a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from Florida A&M University in 1996 and a Master of Business Administration (MBA) from the

University of Michigan in 2000. After college, she joined General Motors as a steering systems engineer while pursuing her MBA.

Rep. Bynum entered politics in 2016 when she ran for the Oregon House of Representatives in District 51 after incumbent Shemia Fagan opted not to seek re-election. Rep. Bynum won the Democratic primary with 66% of the vote and narrowly defeated Republican Representative Lori Chavez-DeRemer in the general election.

During her tenure in the Oregon House, Rep. Bynum was known for her focus on economic development, small business growth, and social justice. In 2023, she chaired the House Committee on Economic Development and Small Business. She was the Chief Sponsor of Senate Bill 4, the Oregon CHIPS Act, which allocated \$210 million to bolster the state's semiconductor industry. Her leadership highlighted her dedication to advancing Oregon's economic competitiveness. She also made history by becoming the first Black legislator in Oregon to receive votes for Speaker of the State House, garnering four votes during the caucus process. Her election marks a historic milestone as the first Black representative from Oregon in the U.S. House.

In 2012, Rep. Mackenzie launched his political career by winning the Pennsylvania House of Representatives election for the 134th district. Following redistricting, he successfully transitioned to represent the 187th district in 2022. Over his tenure, Rep. Mackenzie held numerous leadership positions, including Republican chair of the Labor and Industry Committee and co-chair of the International Relations Caucus. He also served as majority chair of the House Government Oversight Committee, deputy majority whip, and chair of various subcommittees, including Financial Services and Banking and Workforce Development. Rep. Mackenzie was among the Pennsylvania House Republicans who called on Congress to reject and decertify the state's electoral votes in the 2020 presidential election.

Rep. Bresnahan is deeply involved in his community through extensive volunteer work and leadership on numerous boards. He has served as interim president of the SPCA of Luzerne County, past president of the Wyoming Rotary Club, and treasurer of the Tec BRIDGE board and Automated Vehicle Coalition. Rep. Bresnahan has also been active with Junior Achievement of NEPA, Big Brothers Big Sisters of NEPA, the Luzerne County Industrial Development Authority, and the National Electrical Contractors Association. He serves on the boards of the SPCA of Luzerne County, the Forty Fort Cemetery Association, and the Catholic Youth Center.


In 2024, Rep. Goldman transitioned to federal politics, successfully running for Texas's 12th Congressional District.

Rep. Turner began his legal career at Fulbright & Jaworski before founding his firm, Barnes & Turner, in 1983. He became an immigration lawyer and was an adjunct

professor at the Thurgood Marshall School of Law, a seminar lecturer at South Texas College of Law, and a participant in the University of Houston Law School's Continuing Legal Education Programs.

His political career began in 1988 when he was elected to the Texas House of Representatives, representing District 139 in Harris County. Over his tenure, Rep. Turner played pivotal roles on the Legislative Budget Board, the House Appropriations Committee, and the House State Affairs Committee. He was also the chair of the Texas Legislative Black Caucus and the Greater Houston Area Legislative Delegation. His legislative achievements included expanding mental health funding in Harris County, securing state funding for trauma care centers, and advocating for children's health insurance and Medicaid expansion under the Affordable Care Act.

As mayor, Rep. Turner led Houston through challenges such as Hurricane Harvey, advocating for innovative infrastructure improvements and addressing homelessness. His administration prioritized economic development, public health, and environmental resilience, though his tenure ended with Houston facing significant financial deficits.

Representative Brandon Gill (R-TX) is an American politician and former investment banker who will be the youngest Republican in the House of Representatives.

Born on a United States Air Force base to a father who served as an Air Force officer, Rep. Gill grew up on a cattle ranch near Abilene, Texas. He attended Dartmouth College, where he graduated cum laude with a bachelor's degree in history and economics and served as the editor of the conservative student newspaper, The Dartmouth Review. After graduating, Rep. Gill pursued a career in finance as an investment banker.

In 2018, Rep. Gill founded the right-wing news website D.C. Enquirer, positioning it as a platform to defend President

Donald Trump in the public sphere. He also promoted his father-in-law Dinesh D'Souza's controversial 2022 film 2000 Mules, which advanced debunked claims about the 2020 presidential election.

Rep. Gill has stated that his primary policy objective in Congress will be "fortifying the border," aligning with his commitment to strong conservative values. He has also expressed interest in joining the House Freedom Caucus, underscoring his dedication to promoting a hard-line conservative agenda.

During her tenure in the Texas legislature, she authored the Live Well Texas bill, which would have expanded Medicaid in the state. She also served as the Vice-Chair of the Women's Health Caucus in Texas.

In the 2024 election to replace Rep. Colin Allred, Rep. Johnson won the November general election and will

represent Texas's 32nd district in the 119th Congress.

Representative Mike Kennedy (R-UT)



Biography

Representative Mike Kennedy (R-UT) was born in Lansing, Michigan, and earned a Bachelor of Science from Brigham Young University. He later earned a Doctor of Medicine degree from Michigan State University and his Juris Doctor from Brigham Young University. After graduating, Rep. Kennedy began his medical practice in Alpine, Utah, where he worked as a family doctor for Premier Family Medical Group.

Rep. Kennedy began his political career in Utah's House of Representatives after winning his election to represent the 27th District in 2012. During his tenure in the State House, he served on the Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee, the House Health and Human Services Committee, and the House Political Subdivisions Committee.

In 2018, Rep. Kennedy resigned from the Utah House and announced his candidacy to challenge Senator Mitt Romney in the U.S. Senate election. After making it to the Republican primary, Rep. Kennedy lost this election to the incumbent Senator from Utah. In 2024, Rep. Kennedy won the general election to represent Utah's 3rd district in the U.S. House of Representatives.

Representative John McGuire (R-VA)



Biography

Representative John McGuire (R-VA) was born in Richmond, Virginia, and earned a degree from Northwest Florida State College. After graduating, he served as a U.S. Navy Seal for ten years and deployed to various countries. He later founded his physical training business, SEAL Team Physical Training, which has been employed by Virginia Commonwealth University sports teams.

Rep. McGuire began his political career in 2017 after winning his election to represent Virginia's 56th district in the state legislature. During his tenure in the State House, he focused on curing the opioid epidemic, balancing the state budget, bolstering job growth, and expanding education spending. After his successful reelection bid in 2019, Rep. McGuire

announced his candidacy for U.S. Congress in Virginia's 7th congressional district, eventually losing the 2020 general election to his Democratic challenger Abigail Spanberger.

In 2024, Rep. McGuire announced his candidacy for the U.S. House of Representatives in Virginia's 5th district, defeating incumbent Representative Bob Good after his campaign received endorsements from several congressmen and President-Elect Donald Trump.

Biography

Representative Eugene Vindman (D-VA) is an American politician, attorney, and retired U.S. Army officer who dedicated his career to service, ethics, and leadership. Rep. Vindman, who immigrated to the United States as a child from the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic. After graduating with a bachelor's degree in history from the State University of New York at Binghamton, he earned advanced degrees in law and administration from the University of Georgia School of Law, Central Michigan University, and the Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School.

Rep. Vindman served 25 years in the U.S. Army, rising to colonel and receiving numerous military honors, including the Defense Superior Service Medal and the Legion of Merit. His

roles ranged from paratrooper and infantryman to Judge Advocate General's Corps attorney. He was deployed to Iraq and retired from the Army in 2022. As a deputy legal advisor for the National Security Council during the Trump administration, Rep. Vindman played a pivotal role in reporting President Trump's controversial 2019 call with Ukrainian President Zelensky, which became central to Trump's first impeachment. Rep. Vindman identified legal and ethical breaches in the call and reported his concerns through proper channels, facing retaliation and threats alongside his twin brother, Alexander Vindman, who also testified about the incident.

Representative Suhas Subramanyam (D-VA)



Biography

Representative Suhas Subramanyam (D-VA) is an American lawyer, public servant, and Congressmanelect for Virginia's 10th congressional district. He is resident of Ashburn, Virginia, and lives with his wife, Miranda, and their daughters. An accomplished attorney, Rep. Subramanyam has dedicated his career to public service, including volunteering as an EMT and firefighter and serving on the Loudoun Health Council. He was the first Indian-American, South Asian, and Hindu elected to the Virginia General Assembly in 2019 when he won a seat in the House of Delegates for the 87th district.

Born to Tamil-speaking Indian parents from Bengaluru, India, Rep. Subramanyam grew up in Houston, Texas, and attended Clear Lake High School. He earned a

bachelor's degree in philosophy from Tulane University and later graduated from Northwestern University Pritzker School of Law. While in law school, he played a pivotal role in overturning the wrongful conviction of a man sentenced to life in prison, exemplifying his commitment to justice. After law school, Rep. Subramanyam worked as a legislative aide focusing on healthcare and veterans' policy in the U.S. House of Representatives. He later clerked for Senator Dick Durbin (D-IL) on the Senate Judiciary Committee, where he helped reintroduce the DREAM Act.

In 2015, Rep. Subramanyam was appointed as a White House technology policy advisor in President Obama's administration. He led a task force on technology policy, addressing critical issues such as job creation, IT modernization, and regulating emerging technologies. His dedication to public service continued as he transitioned to Virginia state politics, serving in the House of Delegates before being elected to the Virginia Senate in 2023, representing the 32nd district.

Representative Michael Baumgartner (R-WA)



Biography

Representative Michael Baumgartner (R-WA) is an American politician and diplomat currently serving as the 28th Spokane County Treasurer. He previously represented Washington's 6th district in the State Senate from 2011 to 2019, representing Spokane, Airway Heights, and Cheney, and was his party's nominee in the 2012 U.S. Senate race against Democratic incumbent Maria Cantwell.

Rep. Baumgartner attended Washington State University on a scholarship, earning a degree in economics with minors in French and mathematics and graduating as a Stephenson scholar. He furthered his education with a master's degree in public administration from Harvard University in 2002. His early career included volunteering on a Jesuit mission to

During the Iraq War, Rep. Baumgartner served as an economics officer in the Office of Joint Strategic Planning & Assessment at the U.S. Embassy in Baghdad. He worked on the Baghdad Security Plan, where his contributions earned praise from General David Petraeus and Ambassador Ryan Crocker. In 2008, Rep. Baumgartner worked in Afghanistan's Helmand Province as a civilian contractor, where he encouraged poppy farmers to grow food crops, addressing issues tied to the opioid crisis. During this time, he met his wife, Eleanor Mayne, a journalist studying counternarcotics, and the two married in 2010.

Representative Emily Randall (D-WA) is an American politician and activist who is a current member of the Washington State Senate. She earned a Bachelor of Arts in Spanish and women's studies from Wellesley College. Inspired by her sister Olivia, who was born with severe developmental and physical disabilities, Rep. Randall has dedicated her career to advocating for equitable healthcare and public services.

As one of two openly LGBTQ+ women in the Washington State Senate, Rep. Serving as the Senate majority whip, she has led efforts on pivotal bills to lower the Tacoma Narrows Bridge toll by 75 cents,

which took effect in October 2022. Rep. Randall also served on key State Senate committees such as Higher Education, Workforce Development, Health and Long-Term Care, and Transportation.

Representative Riley Moore (R-WV)



Biography

Representative Riley Moore (R-WV) is an American politician serving as the West Virginia State Treasurer since January 2021. Rep. Moore previously represented District 67 in the West Virginia House of Delegates.

Rep. Moore earned an apprenticeship certificate in welding from the C. S. Monroe Technology Center, a bachelor's degree in government from George Mason University, and a master's degree in strategic security studies from the National Defense University. Before joining the private sector, he was a United States House Committee on Foreign Affairs staffer. From 2013 to 2017, Rep. Moore served as Vice President at the Podesta Group, where he worked on various client projects, including the

European Centre for a Modern Ukraine. In 2017, he became a director at Textron.

In 2016, Rep. Moore successfully ran for the West Virginia House of Delegates after Stephen Skinner opted not to seek reelection. He defeated Rod Snyder and served as the assistant majority whip for the Republicans. In 2018, Speaker Roger Hanshaw named Rep. Moore the next Majority Leader, but he lost his reelection bid to John Doyle that same year.

Rep. Moore ran for West Virginia State Treasurer in 2020, facing 24-year incumbent John Perdue in the general election after being unopposed in the Republican primary. During his tenure, Rep. Moore has actively opposed ESG (environmental, social, and governance) investing. In June 2022, he barred six financial institutions, including BlackRock and JPMorgan Chase, from conducting business with the state due to their stance against the fossil fuel industry.

Born to Representative Serafina King, a former member of the Northern Mariana Islands House of Representatives, Del.-elect King-Hinds grew up in Tinian alongside her brother, Senator Karl King-Nabors. She earned a Bachelor of Arts in political science from Loyola Marymount University, a master's degree in human resource management from the Shidler College of Business at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, and a Juris Doctor from the William S. Richardson School of Law.

Del.-elect King-Hinds began her career as Lieutenant Governor

Jesus Sablan's special assistant for projects and community services from 2000 to 2002. She later served in various leadership roles, including as a Commonwealth Public Utilities Commission member, chair of the Commonwealth Ports Authority board, and legal counsel for the NMI Settlement Fund. From 2002 to 2006, she chaired the Northern Marianas College Board of Regents. She also served as executive director of the Tinian Youth Center and chief of staff in the Tinian mayor's office.

The grandson of former Governor Rafael Hernández Colón and Lila Mayoral Wirshing, Resident Commissioner-elect Hernández Rivera graduated from Academia del Perpetuo Socorro. He earned his bachelor's degree from Harvard College and a Juris Doctor from Stanford Law School.

Resident Commissioner-elect Hernández Rivera advocates for Puerto Rico's status as a commonwealth and opposes statehood. In November 2024, he highlighted in an opinion piece in The Hill that, for the first time since 2000, Puerto

Rican voters had chosen a delegate to the United States House of Representatives who opposes statehood. His election marks a significant shift in Puerto Rico's representation in Washington.
